RESOLUTION 04 -08-13M

- WHEREAS,** on November 1, 1994, the United States Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Ho-Chunk Nation (Nation) is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(a) of the Constitution of the Ho-Chunk Nation (Constitution) grants the Legislature the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(i) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to negotiate and enter into treaties, compacts, contracts, and agreements with other governments, organizations, or individuals; and
- WHEREAS,** Article V, Section 2(r) of the Constitution grant the Legislature the power to protect and foster Ho-Chunk religious freedom, culture, language, and traditions; and
- WHEREAS,** Ho-Chunk community members have expressed their ongoing support for the preservation of the Ho-Chunk language through many planning efforts including, but not limited to: the Youth Strategic Plan (1999) and the Ho-Chunk Nation 10-Year Strategic Plan (2002); and
- WHEREAS,** over 1,900 Ho-Chunk community members completed surveys as part of the ANA-funded Ho-Chunk Language Assessment Project to determine the language status of enrolled Ho-Chunk members in Jackson, Monroe, Juneau, Sauk, and Wood counties; and
- WHEREAS,** the Hoocak Waazijja Hacı Language Division, as a means of fulfilling its mission of preserving our sacred language and culture, is seeking the preservation and maintenance of the Ho-Chunk language by developing and testing a standardized curriculum and related materials based on "The Four Season"; and
- WHEREAS,** the Language Division does not currently have the resources to develop such a plan; and

WHEREAS, the Language Division will use the curriculum, teaching guides, and related materials produced during the planning project to provide standardized Ho-Chunk language instruction at the Nation's governmental and community facilities ; and

WHEREAS, the Language Division will also make the standardized curriculum and related materials available for use by Ho-Chunk members in their own homes and other settings,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Ho-Chunk Legislature, pursuant to its constitutional authority, hereby authorizes the Language Division to submit an application to the Administration for Native Americans for the Ho-Chunk Language Preservation and Maintenance Project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the application requests Federal funding of \$171,729 and commits to in-kind matching funds of \$67,199 for Year Three, the final year of the Project.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the in-kind matching funds will come from the Hoocak Language Division's annual budgets; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hoocak Language Division will credit ANA and reference the ANA-funded project on any audio, video, and/or printed materials developed in whole or in part with ANA funds; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President or Vice President is authorized to sign the application and negotiate on behalf of the Ho-Chunk Nation.
