HO-CHUNK NATION LEGISLATURE SELECTION OF TRIBAL SECRETARY

RESOLUTION 07-09-13C

WHEREAS, on November 1, 1994, the United States Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Ho-Chunk Nation ("Nation") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 2(a) of the Ho-Chunk Nation Constitution ("Constitution") gives the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature ("Legislature") the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 2(f) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to set the salaries, terms and conditions of employment for all governmental personnel; and

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 2(g) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the authority to set its own procedures, select its officers, and to enact laws governing attendance of its members, including penalties for absences; and

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 2(x) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to enact any other laws, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes necessary to exercise its legislative powers delegated by the General Council pursuant to Article III including but not limited to the foregoing list of powers; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature enacted the *Legislative Organization Act* (2 HCC § 11) by Legislative Resolution 2/13/01D; and

WHEREAS, Section 2 of the *Legislative Organization Act* provides that one of its purposes is "to establish procedures and rules to govern individual and collective actions of members of the Legislature and to establish uniformity in the proceedings of Legislative business, thereby increasing the efficiency of the Legislature."; and

WHEREAS, Section 7 of the *Legislative Organization Act* provides:

a. The Legislature will select from among its members a Tribal Secretary to serve throughout such Legislator's term. Such selection will occur as early as possible after the Tribal Secretary position becomes vacant for any reason.

b. The Tribal Secretary shall be responsible for signing Legislative Meeting Minutes, signing Resolutions, and other duties as may be assigned by the Legislature through a Resolution.; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 7-07-09A selected former District 3 Representative Hope Smith to be the Tribal Secretary; and

WHEREAS, Former District 3 Representative Hope Smith's term ended as of July 3, 2013, since she did not seek re-election to the Legislature, and a successor Representative was sworn into office for her seat; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature deems it appropriate to now select a different Representative as the Tribal Secretary;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature, pursuant to its Constitutional authority, selects Representative Kathyleen Lone Tree - Whiterabbit to be the Tribal Secretary, who shall serve in such capacity throughout their term of office.

CERTIFICATION

I, the undersigned, as Tribal Secretary of Ho-Chunk Nation, hereby certify that the Legislature of the Ho-Chunk Nation, composed of **13 members**, of whom **13** constituting a quorum were present at a meeting duly called and convened and held that on the **9th day of July, 2013**, adopted the foregoing resolution at said meeting by an affirmative vote of **12 members, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining**, pursuant to the Article V, Section 2(a) and (x) of the Constitution of the Ho-Chunk Nation approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 1, 1994, and that the foregoing resolution has not been rescinded or amended in any way. I further certify that this is a verified copy of said resolution.
