HO-CHUNK NATION LEGISLATURE SUPPORT FUNDING REQUEST TO THE U.S. NATIONAL PARK SERVICE FOR HO-CHUNK NATION TRIBAL HISTORIC PRESERVATION

RESOLUTION 08-05-14L

- WHEREAS**, on November 1, 1994, the United States Secretary of the Interior approved a new Constitution for the Ho-Chunk Nation, formerly known as the Wisconsin Winnebago Tribe; and
- WHEREAS**, the Ho-Chunk Nation ("Nation") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and
- WHEREAS**, Article V, Section 2(a) of the Ho-Chunk Nation Constitution ("Constitution") gives the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature ("Legislature") the power to make laws, including codes, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes; and
- WHEREAS**, Article V, Section 2(d) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to authorize expenditures by law and appropriate funds to the various Departments in an annual budget; and
- WHEREAS**, Article V, Section 2(i) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to negotiate and enter into treaties, compacts, contracts, and agreements with other governments, organizations, or individuals; and
- WHEREAS**, Article V, Section 2(r) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to protect and foster Ho-Chunk religious freedom, culture, language, and traditions; and
- WHEREAS**, Article V, Section 2(x) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to enact any other laws, ordinances, resolutions, and statutes necessary to exercise its legislative powers delegated by the General Council pursuant to Article III including but not limited to the foregoing list of powers; and
- WHEREAS**, the Ho-Chunk Nation Department of Heritage Preservation seeks to present a grant request to the U.S. National Park Service in the amount of \$53,847.00, in 2014, to obtain funding for a Tribal Historic Preservation Officer (THPO), as more fully described in the apportionment warrant and public notice by the National Park Service, and implement the THPO scope of work for FY 2013; and

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WHEREAS, the Nation, through the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature desires to authorize presentation of the Ho-Chunk Nation THPO 2014 grant request to the Mr. James Tucker, National Park Service, Washington, D.C., within the following assurances:

- That extended funding is guaranteed on a yearly basis and provided for ongoing operation of the THPO Program by the Nation with the intention of allocating additional funds to the extent required and necessary on an ongoing basis; and
- That funding be provided for the proposal based upon costs that are competitively bid and reasonable; appropriate for the intended use; and as a project, be achievable through implementation within twelve months; and

WHEREAS, for the purposes of this grant request, and with respect to implementation of the grant award with respect to the supported position, the Nation sets forth agreement and compliance with: Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L.88-352); Title X of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. 1681-1683) which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 794) which prohibits discrimination of the basis of handicap; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended (42 U.S.C. 6101-6107); the Drug Abuse Office and Treatment Act of 1972 (P.L. 92-255), as amended, relating to the nondiscrimination on the basis of drug abuse with the Comprehensive Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism Prevention, Treatment and Rehabilitation Act of 1970 (P.L. 92-616); with the provisions of the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 276a); the Copeland Act (40 U.S.C. 27c, and 18 U.S.C. 874); and the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 327-333).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Nation through the Ho-Chunk Nation Legislature, hereby authorizes Mr. Jon Greendeer, President Ho-Chunk Nation, or Vice-President, Rep. Heather Cloud, to approve, support, and execute the Ho-Chunk Nation Tribal Historic Preservation Officer (THPO) grant request in order to achieve the scope of THPO in favor of the Nation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be effective upon its adoption and approval.

CERTIFICATION
